



INTERMEDIATE LEARNERS PROGRAM -3 YR. OLDS

The primary goal of the 3 year-old intermediate level is to develop healthy social and behavioral skills so children will enjoy the school environment and are prepared to learn in the future. Children develop a tremendous sense of confidence and independence when they learn they are capable of doing things for themselves such as jobs, putting on their coats, taking care of bathroom needs, making decisions about how to spend their time during free play etc. The following are some of the skills introduced through the year.

Social Skills:

Raising hands
Taking turns
Following instructions
Basic problem solving and decision making
Sharing teacher's attention

Pre-Reading Skills:

Name and basic letter recognition
Strengthen vocabulary skills through themed units and Clifford's "thought"

Math Concept Skills:

Counting -counting jar, calendar, literature and various circle time activities
Numeral recognition- matching up a verbal or written number with an object
Simple patterning, sorting and shape recognition

Fine Motor Skills:

Proper scissor usage
Holding crayons and pencils correctly

Gross Motor Skills:

Running
Hopping
Skipping
Group games

All of the above skills are gently incorporated throughout our day into circle time, creative play, music, art and story time. Every child learns differently and will develop these skills at a different rate.
