2016 Results...

An overview...

We finished 2016 with a budget shortfall for the fourth time in five years. The shortfall was primarily a result of pledge income shortfalls at the end of the year and staffing expenses related to filled positions for most of the year. Actual income resumed a downward trend of year over year declines. Unfortunately, this decline accelerated toward the latter half of the year and leaves us with diminished resources moving into the new year.

Key 2016 highlights are as follows:

- Actual expenses exceeded actual income by \$58,969, slightly better than originally planned.
- Actual income of \$1,482,703 was \$48,153 below budgeted amounts.
- Expenses of \$1,541,672 were \$10,816 higher than budgeted amounts, but included the Summer Mission Project allocations.

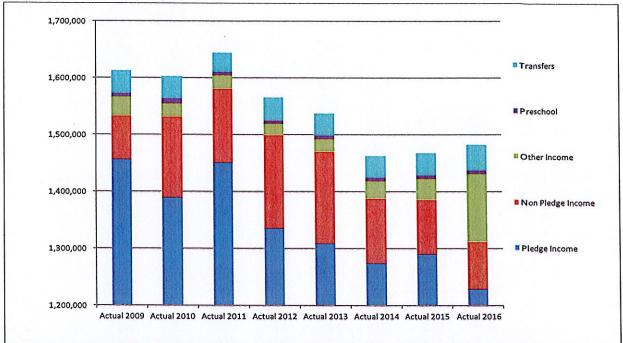

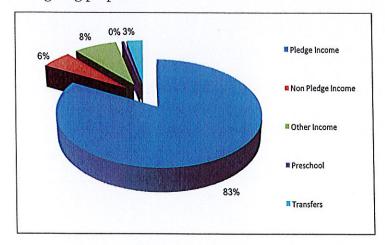


2016 Results...

An overview... Our Gifts...



- Revenue increased in 2016, but core giving continued a long-standing downward trend. Total income (including the summer special giving) in 2016 was \$1,482,703; up from \$1,467,950 in 2015. Pledge revenue decreased \$61,176 from 2015 levels.
- 83% of our general operating fund gifts resulted from congregational pledges, down 5% from 2015, and represents our lowest support in more than a decade, and reversed the trend of the last couple of years of lessening our reliance on reserves to fund the general operating budget.
- Non-pledge income represented only 6% of our total income in 2016, and a drop of 13% in absolute terms. We have moved to an even more conservative estimate of these funds for budgeting purposes.

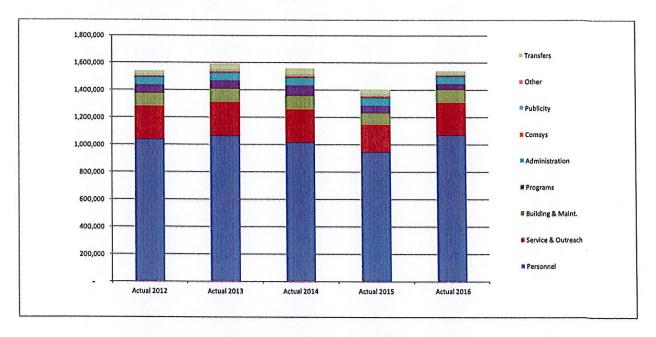

An overview... Use of Our Gifts...



- 69% of our expenses were used to fund personnel related costs in 2016. This represents an increase from 67% in 2015, and results from more fully staffed personnel for the full year.
- In 2016, Service and Outreach expended \$245,505, including the summer Special Mission homeless drive. If the \$68,452 were excluded, expenditures would have been down an incremental 10% from 2015 levels.
 - Service and Outreach, including Special Mission activity, represented 16% of our total expenditures in 2016.
 - The 2017 Ministry Plan continues to place a greater focus on using the success of special mission activities to further supplement the Service and Outreach budget.
- Building and Maintenance, Programs, and Administrative costs remained relatively consistent over the past five years in the aggregate.
