

A Note from Pastor Caroline

"It's just a reminder that there are good people out there," the man said before hanging up the phone. The caller was First Pres's latest recipient of Matthew 25 funding, a veteran who had been living in a tent in West Chester while waiting for the heart surgery that would allow him to get back to the work he loved. Matthew 25 gifts helped this neighbor with a motel room stay while more permanent housing could be arranged. More importantly, he shared that the comfortable bed and food were an experience of God's provision in challenging times.

As Presbyterians we tend not to use the language "good people." We know that we are far from perfect. We do try to be people who respond to God's love by caring for our neighbors and for one another, and it is this response that I am privileged to witness each day as your pastor. In challenging times our congregation has come together with an energy and sense of purpose that is a joy to behold. Whether it was the choir scheduling shifts to offer respite to a caregiver, the Stephen Ministry team expanding their caregiving reach into the community, First Crew's latest playhouse project, over a hundred people packing a congregational conversation, or the youth and Safe Harbor teams providing thousands of meals, the impact of these months goes far beyond counting. And that does not take into account the innumerable ways that you care for one another through Men's Ministry, PW Circles, fellowship groups, Prayer Band, deacon reach-outs, and deep friendships. Following Christ by caring for one another and caring for our neighbors are the twin melodies that have run through this chapter of First Pres's history.

While summer is often a quiet time in churches, the past few months have been filled with planning and projects. Committees have been hard at work on property research, financial organization, hiring support staff, and the many pieces of the pastoral transition process. We have baptized and buried, navigated the changing covid-19 landscape, and started new ministry programs like assisting with the Melton Center, Music Camp, and English Sunday School classes. There is growing lay leadership in worship, and we see a number of new faces in the pews each Sunday.

I look forward to restarting many of the practices and programming that we paused during the pandemic. Beginning September 12, Sunday worship will take on more of a pre-pandemic feel, with three hymns, passed offering, and live children's messages. We will continue to monitor local covid transmission rates and eagerly anticipate dropping mask mandates as they fall. In-person Bridge programming is returning in a slightly shifted format, as are the Chancel and children's choirs. The nursery will be back up and running on Sunday mornings. Though hybrid and zoom meetings have become valuable tools for the church's ministry, every in-person gathering reminds me that there is no substitute for being together.

While we are all longing for a little stability these days, I am aware that this chapter of our church's life is also a gift. These months have proved that while the path forward is not always clear, the Holy Spirit is continually at work, equipping all of us to meet the challenges we face. God is very much present at the corner of Miner & Darlington, raising up capable leaders in all areas of our congregation's life and putting teachers in our midst. There seems to be something about this time that is lighting a fire under our ministries, propelling new energy, creativity, and growth. Whatever the future holds (hopefully a new pastor in short order!), I will always be grateful for the joy you have given me in serving alongside you.

Continuing the Transition Conversation

Sailboat Church: Helping Your Church Rethink Its Mission and Practice

The next opportunity to participate in a church-wide conversation about our current time of transition will be built around the book Sailboat Church: Helping Your Church Rethink Its Mission and Practice. The book's content challenges churches to examine how well they are connecting with the Spirit of God, versus running on human power – an important concept to consider as we move into the season of searching for our new head pastor. There are 3 ways that you can engage in this conversation:

- In-person presentation and conversation: Join us in Fellowship Hall on Sunday, September 12 from 11:45
 1:00 pm. We will share lunch, listen to a presentation on the book, and have ample time for small group conversation.
- **Zoom presentation and conversation:** If you are not comfortable gathering in person (or simply not able to attend on September 12), an online version of this conversation will be offered on Thursday, September 16 at 7:00 pm.
- 40 days of prayer: Regardless of whether you attend these events or not, all church members are encouraged to participate in 40 days of intentional prayer after Kickoff Sunday. This period of praying for the church will coincide with the work of forming our Pastoral Nominating Committee, a process we especially want to be bringing to God in prayer.

The Brass in the Silver Lining

Since the beginning of the pandemic, music directors have been trying to do their best to keep their ensembles active and engaged. I remain impressed and humbled at the level of dedication and participation I've seen here at First Pres, with singers and instrumentalists alike joining together to make music in a safe environment. I never would have thought that despite the unprecedented situation a new ensemble would have been created. Earlier this year, one of my tuba players whose name is Charity reached out to me regarding her brass students. Many of them go to private schools and don't have an opportunity to play in a brass ensemble. She wondered if her students could play with the adults of Miner Street Brass and learn from them. I ran the idea by the adult players who loved the plan of creating a new intergenerational ensemble. We started rehearsing with six students in May 2021, and by the end of June we had another six join the group which resulted in a 20-player ensemble. The new ensemble's goals are promoting live brass music in the West Chester community, as well as playing in church services and concerts here at First Pres. Miner Street Brass Next will lead worship for the first time on Kickoff Sunday, which is September 12.

Matthew 25 Update

Over the past months the Matthew 25 program has continued to support our neighbors in need. While federal aid and eviction moratoriums have cut down on the number of individuals requesting emergency rental assistance, we are finding that many of our neighbors continue to slip through the cracks of the systems meant to support them. Long waiting lines at local agencies have increased the number of people seeking temporary aid while they wait for more permanent support. Recently Matthew 25 supported two disabled veterans, both waiting for housing from the VA. We have found that many



of those receiving aid are employed, such as one family of four living in their car, but their wages are not sufficient to provide for their families. Most of those who come to us are struggling with some kind of health or childcare challenge. Sometimes the needs are simple but heartbreaking, like a new pair of shoes for a man living on the street. The original hope for the Matthew 25 program was to not only provide concrete supports but also to engage in meaningful relationships with those experiencing housing instability. A gift of this program is that lasting friendships have been formed as a result of these efforts. We get calls from these folks when they need someone to pray with in the hospital, or when they have something to celebrate. We deliver cheeseburgers and milkshakes to hotel rooms and join in team meetings with social workers. As this program grows in our community, we look forward to seeing how God continues to make use of it in the lives of our neighbors and in our congregation.

Kids 4 years old –5th grade will be together in one classroom to learn and grow in faith through the Godly Play curriculum.
