

Dear First Pres members and friends,

As it does each year, the fall season catches me off guard. The return to the rhythms of school bus schedules and soccer practice, of Bible studies and choir rehearsals, seems out of step with days that refuse to relinquish the sticky humidity of summer. School clothes are prepped and ready but wet bathing suits still make it to the top of the week's laundry pile. Fresh peaches are on the counter, and the repetitive jingle of the ice cream truck hasn't yet lost its magic. In this season, time folds in on itself and, for a few weeks, we live in two worlds at once.

Already. Not yet. Themes that we Christians know well and that seem particularly poignant at this time in our church's life as we wait for Andrew Esqueda to arrive in October. After so many years of wondering about our next Senior Pastor, Candidacy Weekend and its aftermath have felt, at least to me, a bit surreal. In any given hour I'm wandering between celebration, preparation, and trying not to get so caught up in what's next that I miss what's happening right in front of me.

Knowing that a wonderful new pastor is coming has also lent a sense of urgency to preserving the lessons of these past few years. This wilderness season emboldened our congregation. We took on projects that had seemed daunting prior to 2020, deepened our connections to the community, and overhauled outdated systems. Leaders shifted how we communicated with each other and the wider congregation, seeking out opportunities to be transparent and have face-to-face conversations about difficult topics.

Once a church stops being led by fear – fear of what might happen, fear of losing members, fear of our neighbors and of each other – we are left with space to actually explore Christ's call to us. And while nothing about this time was easy, everything in it seemed to glow with the Holy Spirit's presence.

So what do we do in the weeks before our next chapter starts? What are the tasks and gifts of this time? One, certainly, is to celebrate and give thanks. Thanks to the God who chose to be bold in his presence with us over the past three years, who consistently put people in our midst to guide and strengthen us. I think about Tara Woodard-Lehman, worship visitor Howard Evans, Bill Wilson, Joe Fabiani, and the many, many, many of you who stepped up to serve in new ways. We also can thank the Pastor Nominating Committee for their steadfast and hopeful service to our church.

In his sermon on August 20, Bill Wilson offered a few more suggestions for how to make use of this in-between time:

- 1) **Show Up**. In Bill's experience, church attendance often dips between Candidacy Sunday and the new pastor's arrival. Spending this in-between time together in worship helps connect us to each other and to God, and helps our church be healthy and strong when Andrew arrives.
- 2) Pay Up. Often people ask what they can do to help a new pastor as they get settled. While this hasn't been so much the case at First Pres, many times people stop pledging during transition periods. One of the biggest gifts that we can give Andrew and the church leaders who will be supporting his transition is a balanced budget. No one wants to start a new call asking people to resume giving.
- 3) Look Up. We have so very much to be thankful for. And it's easy to spend a lot of energy thinking about the countless things that aren't just as we would like them to be. In these next weeks, do not lose sight of what is truly important in our congregation and community. Even welcome change can cause people to get a little anxious and edgy, but this is a time to be gracious and loving with one another.
- **4) Give Up**. We have all harbored hopes and expectations around who the next pastor will be for us and to us. If given the opportunity, each of us would have a list of priorities for him. Giving up our individual expectations and priorities will allow us to approach each other and Andrew with curiosity and open hearts.

It has been a great honor to serve alongside you in this capacity over the past three years. You have taught, energized, and inspired me. This is a season I will treasure and look back on with gratitude for the rest of my life. I join with you in excitement for all that lies ahead.

## A LETTER FROM REV. ANDREW ESQUEDA

My Dear First Pres Family,

It was so wonderful to be with you on Candidacy Sunday! I am humbled and honored to be your senior pastor and I can't wait to begin our ministry together in October. You went above and beyond in your welcome to me, Megan, and Maddox, and I cannot wait for you to meet Isaiah and Desmond (and Cali our English Bulldog).



As we prepare to leave Atlanta and join you in West Chester, there are two things that continue to pop into my mind. The first, is the importance of the "cloud of witnesses" that I preached about from Hebrews 12:1. It's amazing the ways in which a cloud of witnesses can transform the ways in which you celebrate joys and experience challenging situations and pain. The second is the idea of "beginnings" or new starts. There is a beginning to everything, but over time there are new beginnings, and the new beginnings don't erase the old ones, they actually affirm them. The truth is, there would be no new beginnings without previous ones.

On October 15 we will begin a sermon series called Beginnings: A Journey Through the Book of Genesis. As we lead up to this series I want to challenge you to join me in thinking about the ideas of the cloud of witnesses and new beginnings. Think about the people that make up your cloud of witnesses and who it is that you might be, or need to be, a cloud of witnesses for. Think about beginnings and new beginnings. Reflect on the history of First Pres, your own history of faith and with the church, and the ways in which God may be using beginnings of the past to spark new beginnings in your own faith and in the life of the church.

Throughout this series, we will look at the ways in which God began the world, the themes of creation, fall, and redemption, the importance of the connectedness of people and creation in God's creating work, and, in light of First Pres's long and important history, what new beginnings God is calling us to.


I am so excited for the journey ahead of us and I cannot wait to arrive and be with you. Until then, please pray for us during this transition, and we will hold you in our prayers as well.




# FAITH FORMATION, CONT.

### **Parenting Book Discussion**

This fall, First Pres is offering a book discussion event for First Pres parents of children and teens to help us consider how we are raising our children with faith. The discussion will be based on the newly released *Woven: Nurturing a Faith Your Kid Doesn't Have to Heal From* by Meredith Miller. The book's description partly reads:

"What if it's our job as parents to instead help our kids get to know God and discover that God can be trusted? And what if faith is not constructed brick by brick, but rather woven strand by strand?... With Woven, families can nurture the kind of faith that can flex and grow, be broken and repaired. This is the sort of faith that can stand up to the life a child will live, the doubts they will encounter, and the questions that will come up along the way."

The discussion will be held on Friday, November 3 from 7 – 9 pm at church and childcare will be available if requested. Parents are not required to read the book ahead of time, but it would be beneficial if some do. Contact Sara with any questions.



# SCHOOLED

#### Christian Faith & Issues

The Christian Faith & Issues class resumes this fall with a focus on education. The planned four-week conversation is a follow-up to last spring's study of poverty, which indicated that a lack of educational opportunities is a direct cause of lack of income.

This fall discussion will focus on major decisions that were made regarding education in Pennsylvania this year. Several Pennsylvania school districts, with parents and advocacy groups, recently sued the PA General Assembly, claiming unfair and unequal practices in funding the PA public school system. The court determined that the funding mechanisms for PA's public schools are "inadequate to the point of being unconstitutional" and must be remedied immediately. We will consider this decision and its implications using *Schooled*, a podcast that gives the insider's story of America's public schools, through the eyes of the students, parents, and educators.


