## **Remember, Imagine**

During our Legacy Sunday weekend, Pastor Tara preached on the dual invitation to remember the past and imagine the future. As followers of Christ, we gather each Sunday around font and table to remember Christ's call upon our lives. In the Scriptures read and proclaimed, this remembrance is transformed into holy imagination, as we begin to grasp what our lives and the world might become if we allowed ourselves to be entirely shaped by the Holy Spirit.

This May marks three years since Greg Stovell announced his departure. When we line those three years up against the billions of years that God has been spinning life into being on our planet, the five thousand years that have elapsed since Scripture was first composed, the two thousand years that the church has been at work in the world, and the nearly two hundred that First Pres has sat on the corner of Miner and Darlington, a mere three seem like nothing at all. And yet, for all of us who have been part of this church over the past thirty-six months, we know that this time has been profoundly meaningful, and, I have long suspected, a deeply holy season in the life of our congregation.

You might remember that during the beginning of this transition the congregation took a survey. The results revealed a congregation that was weary, dispirited, and longing for strong pastoral leadership; not surprising for an era when the pandemic was at its height, and divisions were raging in every sphere of life. While it would have been understandable to sink under the headwinds we faced, instead you all welcomed the Holy Spirit into our midst and set sail. The results were a church as strong and energized as I have ever seen.

# SUMMER BOOK STUDY

This summer, the Justice Ministry Team is offering a congregation-wide book study of *How To Be a Patriotic Christian* by Richard J. Mouw. The publisher summarizes the book this way:

Some Christians see loyalty to America as central to our faith and identity. Other Christians are skeptical that our nation warrants such devotion or attachment. But Richard Mouw encourages Christians to have a healthy sense of national peoplehood that promotes civic kinship and responsible citizenship. He navigates between Christian nationalism on one hand and cynicism about country on the other to avoid the perils of both idolatry and disengagement.

The Justice Ministry Team will host a one-time event to discuss the book in Fellowship Hall on Sunday, June 25 from 11:30 am – 1:00 pm. In acknowledging how his own understanding of how to be patriotic as a Christian is a work in progress, the author writes, "The closest I can come to giving how-to advice about relating faith to patriotism is this: keep wrestling with the questions." We look forward to a thought provoking, grace filled conversation with one another as we faithfully wrestle with our thoughts about the intersection of our faith and civic identities.

"Throughout these last two years, this choir and the members within it have given me more love and support than I could have ever wished for. When I auditioned for the scholarship, one of the questions I was asked was if I was religious. I lied and said yes. I grew up religious, going to Catholic school, CCD, and mass on Sundays, but when I joined First Pres I was grieving the loss of the most important role model in my life, my grandmother. I was filled with so much anger and resentment toward God and religion because I felt as though he failed me. This was the first time in my life where I truly did not know if believing in God was worth it. You all have helped silence that anger and fill the piece of me that was ripped away from my grandmother's death through your kind words, positivity, and caring actions. Coming to church every week and spending time with you all are the reason I was able to start healing, so from the bottom of my heart I thank you."
